Students will be assigned to stable groups based on the number that can safely fit inside a classroom with a goal of 6 feet of distancing between students and a minimum distance of 5 feet. There is no minimum number of students per stable group. The maximum number per stable group will be in adherence to the above distancing guidelines. Online learners will participate virtually in courses to further reduce the number of students participating in onsite stable groups.

If you have departmentalized classes, how will you organize staff and students in stable groups?

Secondary students have a reduced class schedule with a minimum of 2 classes and a maximum of 3 classes per quarter to limit the number of students and staff in a stable group. Online learners will participate virtually in courses to further reduce the number of students participating in onsite stable groups.

If you have electives, how will you prevent or minimize in-person contact for members of different stable groups?

The reduced number of classes per quarter minimizes in-person contact with members of different stable groups. Online learners will participate virtually in courses to further reduce the number of students participating in onsite stable groups.
